Great job to the 161 people who completed 5,487 HundredX surveys and raising approximately \$8,775. This fundraiser is by far the easiest way for GFWC Massachusetts to raise funds, without asking members to spend money or drive across the state to attend an event.

Individual Clubs can enter both the GFWC Newsletter and GFWC Website Contest. Do you ever go on your club website or read the club newsletter and think this is awesome? If you do, then encourage your club to enter the GFWC contests. This is a great opportunity to showcase the talented women who work diligently at keep communications open with club members and your community. These 2 contests do NOT need to be submitted to the state of Massachusetts Communication and Public Relations Chairman, they can be sent directly to the National Chairman.

Club Newsletter Contest - This contest can be submitted by individual clubs.

Entries will be judged on the following elements:

Content quality, including timeliness, clarity, and member impact (30%) Presentation (30%) Design (30%) Adherence to rules (10%)

The newsletter must have been published and dated January 1 – December 31, 2023.

The front page of the newsletter must prominently display the official GFWC emblem and mention membership in GFWC.

Create a cover letter to be included with your entry which contains the following:

Club name, State Federation, Club President's name.

Name and contact information including email address, telephone number and mailing address of the person submitting the entry.

Number of members in the club.

Approximate circulation

An essay of no more than 250 words describing the club's approach to utilizing its newsletter

- All entries must be *printed* and sent via postal mail, postmarked no later than March 15, 2024. This applies to electronic newsletters as well.
- Mail your entry to Jen Nowak, GFWC Newsletter Contest Chairman, 51 Glenn Drive, Wilbraham, MA 01095. The envelope must be clearly marked GFWC Newsletter Contest.

Club Website Contest - This contest can be submitted by individual clubs.

Entries will be judged on the following elements:

Ease of navigation

Overall appearance

Links to GFWC website and State website

Links to GFWC/State/Club affiliate organizations

Current and relevant information

Ease of ability to contact.

\*Private Member Only" area will not be judged. <u>To enter the contest, include in the body of the email the following:</u>

Club name and State the club is located in

Website address

Club President's name and contact information including email address.

Name and contact information of person submitting the entry.

Number of club members

250-word essay describing why their website is a valuable resource to members and potential members.

Submissions must be made via email to CPRentries@charter.net by March 15, 2024.

The subject line of the submissions email must read Website Contest Entry.

Club Level: A first, second, and third place certificate will be awarded to three clubs in the nation.

Individual Clubwoman can enter both the GFWC MA Photography and GFWC MA Writing Contests. The GFWC MA Writing Contest can also be entered by Youth.

Let's talk Photography. Have you ever taken a picture with your cell phone? Have you used a digital camera? Have you ever taken the "perfect" shot and gotten compliments when you post it on <u>Facebook? Have</u> you considered taking that photo and entering it in the GFWC Photography Contest?

What about Writing? Who has not written a thoughtful thank you note or a thinking of you message to a friend or relative? Have you ever considered writing your thoughts in a poem? Or even tackling writing a short story? Have you considered taking that writing and entering it in the GFWC Writing Contest?

#### MEMORIAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS FOR GRADUATE STUDIES

The Memorial Education Committee has met to determine the field of study for the 2023 graduate scholarships and update application materials. Sandy Krafsig (GFWC Northboro Junior Women's Club) and Maureen Crowley (Braintree Women's Club) serve on the committee along with GFWC MA Treasurer Katie Robey and President T Jablanski.



**SPECIAL EDUCATION** is the field of study selected for 2024 Memorial Education scholarships. Special Education teachers continue to be in high demand. Federal law recognizes 13 disabilities as requiring special education, including autism; hearing and vision impairments; differing emotional/intellectual/learning disabilities; and speech or language impairments. For a career that is critical to so many young people in our communities, yet remains moderate in pay, we can help our scholarship recipients by reducing their debt accrued for the graduate work required to work in this field. Memorial Education Scholarships award amounts of at least \$3,000 to finalists selected following an interview process, and the growth of this investment account allows GFWC MA to award multiple recipients.

#### **REPORT WRITING MESSAGE FROM**

#### 2ND VICE PRESIDENT, TERRY ROUVALIS

It's that time of the year again: Report writing time! You have until January 31, 2004, to tell us what activities kept your club busy this past year. Put on your thinking caps, check your meeting minutes, and gather your chairman reports so you can record the results on your **GFWC MA Club Statistical Reporting Form**.

What information are we looking for, you ask? The first thing you need to determine is what **Community Service Program, Special Program, or Advancement Plan** your project falls under? Once that fact is determined, how many members participated? How many hours of work did it involve? Did you raise any money? Was it donated to a cause? Or did the club donate in-kind goods? After you record the basics of the report it is time to go onto the details. Where did this project take place? What did it involve? Is it an activity you do regularly? Did you do something different with it this year? How was it promoted---in print, online, in-person? Was there anyone other than members involved? Did you work in cooperation with another organization? These are only a few points to consider including in your narrative, but I think you get the idea. Detail, detail.

We want to know what you did, whether you are a small club that only does one project a year, or a larger club that does several projects. You can write up to three narratives for each **Community Service Pro**gram, Special Program, or Advancement Plan. The Project Report forms as well as the GFWC MA Statistical Reporting Form are on <u>www.GFWCMA.org</u>. Don't forget to complete the GFWC MA Club Statistical Reporting Form which qualifies your club for the Presidents Club Performance Award bowls presented at our Annual Convention. Reports need to be received via mail or email at Headquarters by January 31, 2024.

Should you have any questions, need any help such as determining what category your project belongs, Please, Please, email me, call me, or yell at me. I am only too happy to help. I along with my fellow Executive Committee members and Board of Directors want every club to Sparkle and Shine.

#### GFWC of Massachusetts Junior Membership Report Writing Information for Reporting Year 2023

The report-writing season is here! Below is some information regarding how to go about taking care of your reports, as well as some helpful examples of a project write up.

There are a total of 13 reports and one **GFWC MA Junior Membership Club Statistical Reporting Form** we would like to receive from each club:

Special Programs (SP) ~ Domestic and Sexual Violence Awareness and Prevention, and Advocates for Children

**Community Service Programs (CSP)** ~ Arts and Culture, Civic Engagement and Outreach, Education and Libraries, Environment, and Health and Wellness.

Advancement Areas (AA) ~ Communications and Public Relations, Fundraising, Leadership, Legislation/Public Policy, Membership and WHRC.

The guidelines, documents, and deadline information you will need can be found on the gfwcma.org website. Look for the Report Writing page under the Junior Membership tab or follow this link: <u>Junior Member-</u><u>ship Reporting Guidelines</u>

Each community SP, CSP, and AA has its own document, when saving the file on your computer, rename it with the specific SP, CSP, and AA name and add your club name.

Now it's time to fill out your club data. Fill out the grid at the top by using the same figures as the statistical sheet. Under that grid, you have the option to write a detailed description of up to four projects you did in that area. Here is one example of how more details can really tell your story:

 $\#1 \sim$  Anytown Junior Women's Club held our annual Halloween costume parade for the elementary school. Many children showed up and families donated canned goods to the local food pantry. We gave out prizes to winning costumes and sent in an article to the newspaper afterward.

 $#2 \sim$  Anytown Junior Women's Club held its annual Halloween costume parade for the Anytown Elementary School. Over 40 families showed up and participated. Families brought canned goods for the food pantry. Prizes were awarded and a press release went to the newspaper following the event with pictures. 6 members spent 4 hours preparing and executing this event.

#### #3 ~ Halloween Costume Parade – 6 members/24 hours/68 items donated (\$98 in kind)

GFWC Anytown Junior Women's Club held its Annual Halloween costume parade for the Anytown Elementary School, with over forty families in attendance. To participate in the parade, families were encouraged to bring a donation to the school's food pantry. AJWC was proud to deliver over 68 items to the food pantry the following week. When prizes were awarded to the winning children, pictures were taken, and a press release was then drafted and sent to the town newspaper for publication.


