Guidelines

- Clubs complete the DV Grant Application Form and submit to GFWC Massachusetts headquarters by October 10, 2019. Grants will be awarded at Fall Meeting October 19, 2019 in honor of Domestic Violence Awareness Month.
- Clubs must use the award to fund a program that directly benefits victims of domestic violence or sexual violence. Funds may be used for monetary or material donations, awareness materials, or any project or program described in the application that would be implemented with the funds given them.

Constitution (enabling women to vote), and kicking off a year of commemorations celebrating 100 years since the 19th Amendment was adopted in 1920. The event features a live performance by <u>Boston Children's Chorus</u> and an original play. The event is free and open to the public.
