If you have not yet contacted your local high school(s) student counselors regarding MassSTAR, please do. It is time for them to choose their student and get information from MassSTAR. They can do this by going to the MassSTAR website (massyouthleadership.org/massstar). As of February 10th the MassSTAR website has announced that the **2018 MassSTAR Citizenship Conference** will be held on **Friday, June 1 through Sunday, June 3 at Lasell College, Newton.**

Treasurer's Tidbits

Treasurer T Jablanski can't emphasize enough the importance of filing your club's 990N. If your club accepts any money or donations from the public which are thought to be tax deductible by the contributor, your club must have a valid 501(c)3 designation. If you do not file your *e-Postcard* on time, the IRS may send you a reminder notice but you will not be assessed a penalty for late filing the *e-Postcard*. However, an organization that fails to file required *e-Postcards* (or information returns – Forms 990 or 990-EZ) for three consecutive years will automatically lose its tax-exempt status. The **automatic revocation** of the organization's tax-exempt status will not take place until the filing due date of the third year.
